Clerk to include the approval of expenditure at next F&GP.</p> <p>Clerk to meet with a select group of representatives from the Parents & Friends Association to endorse the decision.</p> <p>Cllr McLean provided estimated costs for total refurbishment of the existing equipment and local tradesman have been contacted to supply quotes for the completion of maintenance work. 1740	<p>Allotment Association Matters</p> <p>The AA held an Extraordinary Committee Meeting on 8th October 2025 the Tenancy Agreement between Tenants & the Association were amended with minor changes focussed on the Code of Conduct.</p> <p>Members of the AA are concerned about the fair division of the water bills between tenants. Since the introduction of poly tunnels, greenhouses, half plots v full plots finding a fair equation is proving difficult. As a potential solution, a suggestion to install individual meters on each plot ensuring plot holders only pay for the water they use.</p> <p>DA estimated the costs of installation would be approximately £1600.00.</p> <p>Members were concerned about cost benefit? Item to be carried forward to F&GP to establish financial feasibility.</p> <p>Members acknowledged the Local Plan Consultation identified the Brushy Bush allotments land as potential housing development. Cllr IM to clarify how Community Infrastructure Levy income can be spent on fencing and improving accessibility.</p> <p>Clerk to follow up on Sheasby Close boundary wall safety issues with Highways. There is a large amount of vegetation and 'trees' growing through the wall which is impeding pedestrians and vehicles along Frogmore Road. Along with the usual collection tins there is this year RBL has adopted the use of a "Smartphone app" called TOUCAN which allows you to use your own smartphone as a cashless payment terminal so that you can take contributions in a convenient way.</p> <p>The Community Speed Watch Team are available under Colin Chambers lead to organise the physical road closure of the High Street on Remembrance Sunday. 1745	<p>Community Christmas Tree Proposal</p> <p>Members appreciated and approved with thanks local residents' request to sponsor this year's community Christmas Tree.</p>

1747	<p>Matters to Report</p> <p>Members agreed to progress the replacement of the office laptop and a permanent projector installation to improve presentations. RH to make recommendations to F&GP committee.</p> <p>EV Charging Point – Village Hall</p> <p>Dorset Council's Project Team Leader for EV Charging Ahead Scheme contacted the PC following the submission of our signed licence. The partner company MER have unexpectedly taken the strategic decision to withdraw from the fast AC charging market to focus on rapid charging. Therefore, the license has not been counter signed. The project has been on hold. A new partner Joju has been identified and are currently working on the finer details.</p>	RH

	<p>Bonfire Extravaganza will be held on Saturday 1st November 2025 – Organisers request the use of the CLT land opposite the Recreation Ground. Cllr Meaden agreed to trim in readiness for extra car parking.</p> <p><u>Sixpenny Handley & Pentridge Response to the Local Plan Consultation was submitted to Dorset Council on 13/10/25.</u></p> <p>LA/SIXP/001 Up to 70 houses on back lane opposite the ongoing new development</p> <p>Transport. Back Lane is a narrow road bounded by hedgerows with passing places. It already sees excessive levels of through traffic for its capacity and presents challenges for pedestrian use. Previous Local Plans dating back to the 1990's have recognised and conditioned (but not enforced) that further residential development would require upgrading to a "proper" 2 lane road from the junction of Red Lane with the B3081 on the approach to the village from Handley Cross roundabout up to where back land re-joins the B3081 opposite the school. The addition of 70 or so properties along Back Lane on this identified site will bring a significant increase in pedestrian use which presents an unacceptable risk without extensive works to improve safety and amenity issues for residents. Road widening, pavements and potentially a pedestrian crossing site will be required.</p> <p>Flood Risk. The village is subject to increasingly well documented groundwater flood risks. Recent additional developments will further increase surface water run-off into the lower part of Back Lane, Red Lane, Frogmore Lane. The addition of a further 70 properties will again increase surface water run-off in to this lower area. Any proposed development of the scale in this site must be informed by a detailed Flood Risk Assessment for both Groundwater and Surface Water.</p> <p>Infrastructure</p> <p>A development of 70 properties on this site (up to 100 if LA/SIXP/001 is included) will add a significant additional burden to the foul water drain and treatment system. The village has a foul water system which is viewed by many residents as being at the limit of safe capacity. The Frogmore Lane and Dean Lane drainage systems have in the past been over faced by Groundwater flows and there is significant local concern that the village foul water systems will be compromised by future groundwater and surface water flows if significant additional numbers of residential properties are built. A detailed assessment of the village's foul water capability and capacity will be required for this site</p> <p>Essential Services, Amenity, Health and Education</p> <p>Currently the village suffers from a poor choice of bus routes and an infrequent service. An increase of the village population on the scale that the 2 sites brings would need an improved public transport service, particularly on the existing routes to Salisbury.</p> <p>The village surgery would probably need to increase capacity from current levels</p> <p>LA/SIXP/003 This is the site for up to 33 houses on Common Road including the and the CLT have applied to build 11 affordable homes</p>	<p>SM</p>
