<p><b>633</b></p>	<p><b>Dorset Council Cranborne Chase Councillor Piers Brown</b></p> <p>New dog fouling signs have been appointed in Pentridge along with regular patrols carried out by Dorset Councils' Dog Warden.</p> <p>Tour of Britain Cycle Race will be passing through Tarrant Kingston on 10<sup>th</sup> September 2022.</p> <p>Dorset Council rolled out new survey for Adult Social Care 'a small box to register atmosphere changes' which doesn't require wifi mobile phone connections.</p> <p>96% of school applications received their first choice in Reception &amp; junior schools.</p> <p>DC publicised a confidential school meal eligibility checker to be bought in.</p> <p>School Bus consultation highlighted the expense families are faced with for 16+ aged students – rural families are penalised.</p>

<p><b>637</b></p>	<p><b>Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebration – Extracts Community Entertainments Team</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Donations of £2,000 received towards the celebrations means we are well on target to cover our costs - including repaying the £2,500 to the PC if required.</li> <li>• Ticket sales have not really taken off yet but it is a bit early. We will be getting the posters and banners up over the next few days and handing out flyers.</li> <li>• Advertising in the Blackmore and Salisbury Journal over the coming weeks.</li> <li>• Require willing volunteers from the PC to help during the day, especially on car park duty.</li> <li>• Request for a member of the Council or appropriate Service person to do a short tribute to Her Majesty - followed by the National Anthem.</li> <li>• Next volunteers' briefing meeting on 24 May in the Parish Office.</li> </ul> <p>Members were pleased with the progress made and suggested local resident and ex-serviceman Mr William Chorley be approached to deliver the tribute to Her Majesty on the day of the event. <p><b>639</b></p>	<p><b>Highways Matters</b></p> <p>Correspondence received from local resident of Woodyates requesting the installation of a (red triangle) warning sign of Horses crossing. There are stables situated just off the junction on the A354 and it is a popular crossing point for riders – it is a particularly busy and notoriously fast part of the highway.</p> <p><b>Response from Dorset Council:</b> No budget and currently an approximately 2 year waiting lists for new signage.</p>	

	<p><b>Response from Parish Council:</b> Clerk to contact Community Highways Mr Mark Adams to request a quote for the installation of x2 900mm signs, posts and the installation.</p> <p>Clerk to chase DC for the collection and repositioning of the refurbished fingerpost at Cashmoor/Larmer Tree junction which is currently being stored at Myncen Farm.</p> <p>Communication continues between residents of 17 The Orchard and the PC regarding the PCs request for the privately owned traffic cones to be removed. Clerk spoke to residents to establish their frustrations with parking arrangements in The Orchard (<i>Clerk previously sought clarity from Highways regarding ownership of the pavement – confirmation that all areas are subject to Highway authority therefore it is not permitted to block or save parking spaces</i>).</p> <p>The main problem for the residents of No 17 is that unless they park along side of their own property others will park there which is very close proximity to the property and privacy is compromised. The residents were asked to monitor the situation by keeping a record of any inconsiderate parking.</p> <p>CCIO are due to meet on 18<sup>th</sup> May – to discuss supporting the purchase of an additional SID so approve expenditure when /if CCIO have approved. The costs of an additional SID £2500.00 +vat.</p> <p>Colin Chambers and Clerk changed the battery as it had stopped working and we moved it to Back lane location.</p>	<p><b>Clerk</b></p>
