Dorset Council Cranborne Chase Councillor Piers Brown – joined via MS Teams

Cllr Brown explained that the Local Plan consultation document sets out opportunities for meeting the needs of the Dorset Council area. It will help form the Dorset Local Plan which will be used when making planning decisions in Dorset.

The Local Plan will be Dorset Council's response to the Governments' commitment to address the shortage of housing, to enable economic growth and deliver essential infrastructure to enable the growth. It will also set out how planning decisions will seek to conserve and enhance the environment including measures to address climate change.

The consultation documents can be found online ay www.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/dorset-is-changing.

Cllr Mereweather (Chairman of the SHCLT) confirmed a CLT advisory contact is meeting with DC Housing and Planning Team on 29thAugust and is hopeful of a positive update.

The CLT are on the cusp of submitting a planning application for an affordable housing development on land currently owned by Dorset Council. The land was designated as CLT land but the recent local plan consultation indicates that the land is now available for general development.

Members of the PC were keen to ask questions in relation to Community Land Trust to gain clarity and understand the impact on CLT projects.

What is Dorset Council attitude to maximising revenue rather than supporting previous commitments?

Is it Dorset Council's intention to maintain strategic plans for affordable housing?

Members discussed Community Infrastructure Levy payments and how drainage, sewage infrastructure, Back Lane pedestrian access and the local first School could be positively impacted.

The potential changes to CIL charge levies? 15% to 25%?

Cllr Brown confirmed his personal support for the continuation of CLT projects and recognises the shortcomings of the consultation documents and believes the Parish Council should submit local plan comments.

It was noted that a Neighbourhood Development Plan has the ability to influence, shape and deliver the right local outcome. Carry forward this item to a Planning Committee meeting.
