Further quotes to complete the remaining hedge sought from local contractor.</p> <p>Local contractors and woodland specialists to be involved to promote, educate and involve volunteers. Clerk to contact Mr Mike Dyer to co-ordinate with St Mary’s Church.</p> <p>A further successful application to The Woodland Trust has been completed 420 hedge saplings will be delivered in 2023 in order to fill any gapping.</p> <p><b>Sports Pavilion</b></p> <p>A full energy review of the premises to be carried out in 2023 including light sensors, boilers, lighting, heat pumps and solar energy options.</p>

<b>849</b>	<p><b>Highways Matters</b></p> <p>Jobs completed by Highways  1205872 – Blocked gullies, drains blocked High Street, Dean Lane, Frogmore Lane.  1205874 – Request to clear ditches at Dean Lane &amp; Frogmore Lane.  1205878 – Request to clear ditches Back Lane.</p> <p>The Clerk, Cllr Adams &amp; Cllr Brown attended an ‘on the ground’ meeting with Mr Mark Adams Highways Manager to discuss a number of outstanding issues:</p> <p>Q: Whose responsibility is the Sheasby Close footpath? – dilapidated fencing &amp; out of date street light.  A: Historically an East Dorset Council owned asset and has been placed on a Dorset Council list of areas to be addressed, an application for funding has been submitted and the outcome is due in April 2023.</p> <p>Q: The Orchards’ Green is routinely being driven over by large delivery vehicles entering the close. Due to road parked vehicles the turning space is reduced which forces some large vehicles onto the grassed area. DC will not install a large rock or similar due to the risk of being sued by drivers damaging their vehicles – the risk is too great. The PC also declined the request from locals to install a bollard as a deterrent as it is a problem created by inconsiderate parking.</p> <p>Clerk to report to soak away pond along Frogmore Lane to the Flood Risk Department at Dorset Council.</p>	<b>Clerk</b>
